This will be a good course for athletes, coaches and parents that wish to know the relevant changes and current applications as it applies to Sparring (kyorugi). This course was created and mandated by Taekwondo Canada and will be taught by Master Barb Marian – International Referee; WT America Kyorugi Referee Chair and the TKD Canada Referee Chair for Taekwondo Canada and facilitated by myself (Charles Bennett), National Referee and NS Provincial Referee Chair.

Provincial Referee Certification Program Purpose:

1. To develop provincial referees and corner judges to fairly and accurately conduct Taekwondo games according to the competition rules set out by World Taekwondo.
2. Provincial Certification will qualify Nova Scotia referees and corner judges to be prepared for and get the most out of the National Level Referee Seminars.
3. To create three levels of Provincial Referees for incentive to improve upon their referee skills.
4. To educate athletes, coaches and parents regarding the rules and how they affect the game.
5. To create and associate P3 Referee designation for young referees who can, through the mentorship of the MTU and the referee association of Nova Scotia increase their knowledge and improve their skills to one day become a National Referee is so desired.
6. To standardize refereeing and corner judging in the Maritimes to keep contests fair and safe for the athletes.

7. This provincial referee seminar meets the referee training requirements for Dojang Coach certification. Further, certified coaches will earn three (3) maintenance points toward certification renewal for contexts in which they are certified.

Requirements for Certification:

- For an individual to become a “Provincial P3 Associate Referee”, they must:
 - Be 13 years of age or older,
 - Hold a minimum rank of a red belt or above,
 - Obtain a mark of 50% or above on the examination
 - They must complete the provincial referee course.
- For an individual to become a “Certified P3 Level Provincial Referee” they must:
 - Be at least 15 years of age,
 - Hold a minimum rank of red belt,
 - Obtain a mark of 50% or above on the examination
 - Be required to officiate in at least 1 MTU sanctioned tournament.
 - They must complete the provincial referee course.
- For an individual to become a “Certified P2 level Provincial Referee” they must:
 - Hold a minimum rank of a 1st degree black belt,
 - Be registered with the WTF Canada Black Belt Kukkiwon database,
 - Obtain a mark of 60% on the examination,
 - Be required to officiate in at least 2 MTU sanctioned tournaments besides the provincials,
 - Be required to officiate in at least 1 provincial tournament.
 - They must complete the provincial referee course a second time.
- For an individual to become a “Certified P1 level Provincial Referee” they must:
 - Hold a minimum rank of a 1st degree black belt,
 - Be registered with the WTF Canada Black Belt Kukkiwon database.
 - Obtain a mark of 65% or above on the examination,
 - Be required to officiate in at least 2 MTU sanctioned tournaments besides the provincials,
 - Be required to officiate in at least 1 provincial tournament.
 - They must complete the provincial referee course a third time.
- The course will be open to anyone interested in learning more about the rules of Taekwondo; unless they meet any of the above criteria will not qualify to become a certified provincial referee.
- In order to be eligible to be a certified provincial Referee you must be a Member in Good Standing with an Affiliate School in good standing with the Maritime Taekwondo Union.
- If a P3 candidate scores a mark of above 65% or above on the examination and meets the above practical experience they may eligible, (at the discretion of the Referee Director) to obtain a level P2 or P1 referee status with the MTU.
- All potential candidates for provincial certification must be recommended by the Referee Director.

Course Information:

You will require pens, pencils, notebooks and a lunch. Course outlines and study material will be emailed to candidates one week before the course; you will have to print your own copy. We will be using the June 24, 2018 updated rules for this seminar. A list of suggested material will be sent out for all to study prior to writing the test. Doing this in advance will enable candidates to get more from the course and to be better prepared for their test.
